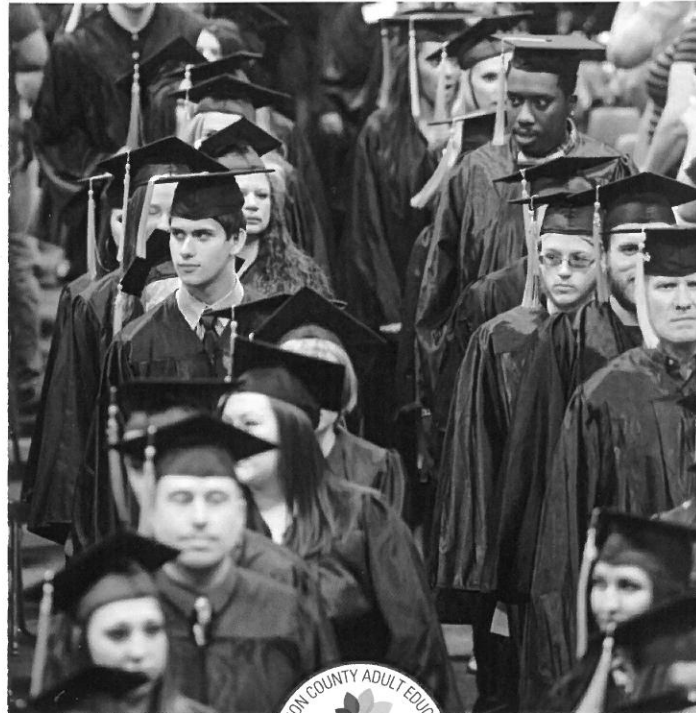

FALL 2019 JOHNSON COUNTY ADULT EDUCATION REGISTRATION

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION COURSES CAN HELP YOU WITH:

- Basic skills in reading, writing, math and everyday survival skills
- Test preparation for the General Educational Development (GED®) test
- The creation of a study plan for your individualized learning
- Computer and work-ready skills

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Programs are designed for individuals age 16 and older who are no longer in school.

- If you are age 16 or 17, you will need to provide a high school attendance disclaimer from the public high school in the school district where you currently live.
(Contact the school's administrative offices for this document.)

WHERE ARE PROGRAMS OFFERED?

Programs are offered at Antioch and Gardner Libraries, West Park Adult Education Center and JCCC's Olathe Health Education Center (OHEC).

WHY ATTEND?

- Class size is small, with friendly people who are also seeking skills to improve their lives.
- A transition coach will assist you with your future plans.
- Volunteer tutors provide you one-on-one attention.
- Professional instructors and volunteers provide you with one-on-one attention.

WHEN CAN I ATTEND?

Class sessions go from August through May (an academic year).

REGISTRATION OPTIONS

- Register via phone by calling Continuing Education Registration: **913-469-2323** (8 a.m.–5 p.m.)
or
- Register in-person at the location where you plan to attend classes
- Required at registration
 - A \$50 nonrefundable registration fee for materials, paid by check, money order or credit/debit card (cash is not accepted)
 - A high school attendance disclaimer if you are 16 or 17 years old

If you are planning to take the GED® exam, you will need a government-issued document with a photograph such as a passport or driver's license.

Registration is first-come, first-served. Once classes are full, registration closes.
