Reading is a wonderful way to spend time – but many people have difficulty reading traditional books.

Talking Books is a no-cost, personalized service that provides audio and braille reading materials to Kansans who need them.

Anyone with a visual impairment, physical impairment, or reading disability that prevents them from reading conventional books or magazines is eligible for the program with certification from an authorized professional.

No library card is necessary to use this free service.

Many types of professionals can certify that a person is eligible for Talking Books. The list includes:

- Doctors
- Nurses
- Professional staff of long-term care facilities
- PTs and OTs
- Social workers and case managers
- Teachers
- Librarians

Getting started is as simple as a visit or call to one of these professionals, who can assist in filling out, certifying and submitting an application.
